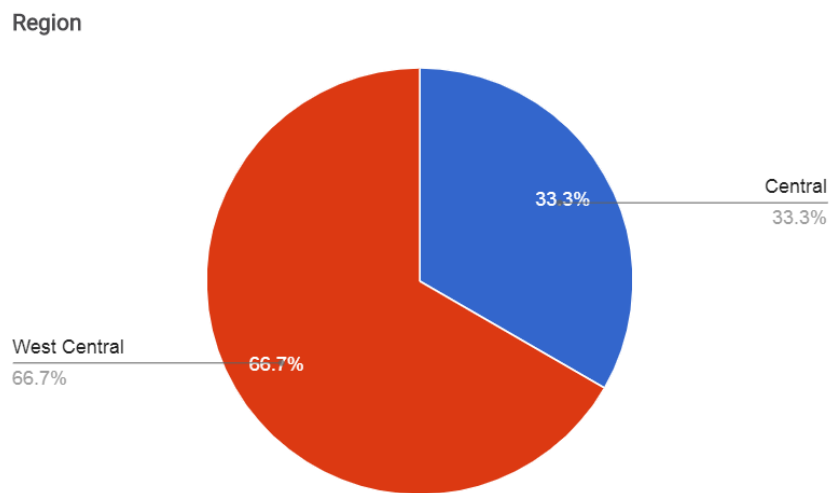

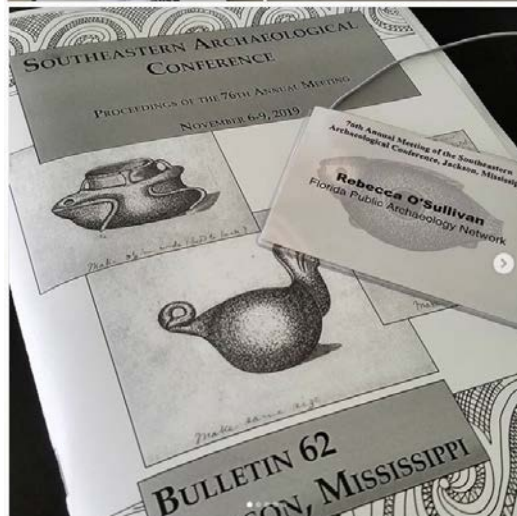
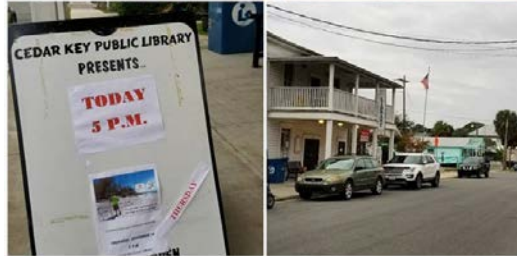
## Quarter Highlights:
